7 Mistakes That Drive Buyers Away (and How to Avoid Them)

#### Introduction

The living room is the most viewed space in MLS photos and the one where buyers spend the most time during a visit.

It's where they imagine family moments, entertaining guests, and relaxing.

A poorly designed living room can cost your sellers tens of thousands of dollars.

In this guide, discover the 7 most common mistakes—and our expert solutions to turn the living room into a true buyer magnet.



### 1. Oversized Sofa

- Mistake: Choosing an XXL sofa that overwhelms the room.
- Consequence: The space feels cramped and cluttered, making movement difficult.
- 5 Impact: In a \$1M home, this can cost up to \$20,000, as buyers associate reduced space with reduced value.

- Follow the 2/3 rule: the sofa should not exceed two-thirds of the wall's width.
- Choose well-proportioned furniture + structured cushions.



# 2. Undersized Rug

- Mistake: A rug that "floats" under the coffee table or sofa.
- Consequence: The room feels tight and poorly proportioned.

- In a living room, the rug should at least cover the front legs of the main furniture pieces.
- Aim for a size that defines the living area (minimum 8x10 ft in most cases).



### 3. TV as the Focal Point

- Mistake: Designing the room around the television.
- Consequence: The space loses its "wow" factor and doesn't evoke warmth or connection.

- Make the fireplace, artwork, or a window the focal point.
- The TV should be present but discreet.



# 4. Furniture Pushed Against Walls

- Mistake: Placing everything against the walls to "make the room look bigger."
- Consequence: The space feels cold, impersonal, and less functional.

- Pull furniture slightly forward to create cozy zones.
- Use rugs and coffee tables to define sub-areas.



# 5. Poor Lighting

- Mistake: Relying on a single ceiling light or mismatched lighting sources.
- Consequence: A messy ambiance and dull photos.

- Use the triple-source method: ceiling light + table lamps + floor lamps.
- Harmonize color temperature (between 2700K and 3000K for a warm glow).



### 6. Too Many Small Decorations

- Mistake: Overloading with candles, trinkets, and tiny frames.
- Consequence: The eye gets distracted, and the room loses impact.

- Follow the 2–3 strong elements per surface rule.
- Favor sculptural pieces (large vases, artwork, plants).



## 7. Poorly Hung Curtains

- Mistake: Curtains that are too short or hung too low.
- Consequence: The room looks smaller and ceilings lower.

- Install rods 4-6 inches below the ceiling.
- Choose curtains that just touch the floor.
- Use neutral, flowing fabrics to visually elongate the space.



### A Must-Do Calculation

A poorly designed living room can reduce a property's sale price by 2-5%.

On a \$1M home, that's \$20,000 to \$50,000 lost.

With professional home staging, the average investment in a living room (furniture, decor, styling) is around \$3,000 to \$5,000.
